- ☐ College of Employment Services (CES)
- Support individuals with intellectual development disabilities. 15 Week online course outlined by the Association of Community Rehabilitation Educator's and the Certified Employment Support Professional exam. Cohorts are online; 67 professionals.
- Free online courses that Combination of real-time and online training with a requirement of 4 live sessions.
- · In 2020 7 cohorts, 87 professionals trained

Programs

☐ Project SEARCH

- Initiated in 2013, year to school-to work internship for youth ages 18-22.
- Program is hosted by business and full collaboration between local school districts, New Mexico Department of Vocational Rehabilitation (NMDVR), NM Department of Health/Developmental Disabilities Supports Division (DDSD), and UNM Center for Development and Disability Partners for Employment (UNM CDD PFE).
- 10-week rotations in a year
- Goal to obtain employment by the end of internship
- Current agencies: UNM Hospital, Embassy Suites, Hilton Garden Inn, City of Farmington Municipal Services, Presbyterian Rust Medical Center, Las Cruces Project SEARCH, City of Farmington Project SEARCH, Pueblo of Pojoague and Holloman Air Force-Alamogordo

☐ School-to-work Transition (SWT)

- Works with PFE in New Mexico communities supporting local employment for locally
- Family Transition Resource Guide: resources for families, advocates, teachers, and mentors supporting transition of youth with disabilities to adulthood.
